Old Business:

- 1. Siskiwit River Protection and Access Update Updates to be covered under Item 2 on the agenda.
- 2. Siskiwit River Protection and Access -request to rescind supporting resolution
 The Planning Commission at their December meeting voted unanimously to "rescind its motion of support made on Feb. 4, 2016 based on the new information provided to the public in November. The project appears to be contrary to the Comprehensive Plan for the Town of Bell as written in the Land Use Element: Page 9-2 where it states that Residential 1 (R-1) districts provide for permanent residential developments that should be protected from traffic hazards and the intrusion of incompatible land uses." A petition with 63 signatures was received supporting the rescinding of the supporting Siskiwit River Protection and Access resolution. Discussion followed. M. Lazorik made a motion to table this to next month's board meeting, so that more facts could be obtained. Y. Fleming 2nd the motion. Unanimous decision.
- 3. Birch Hill natural area Update

 There has not much progress. There is a topographical map of the area and an overlay of the area. George Lazorik is working on a potential route. M. O'Bryon will be meeting with M. Hipsher to discuss the project.

1. Open Bids for Siskiwit River Dredge

- M. Lazorik made a motion to accept bid from Nelson and V. Lewis Hay 2nd the motion. Unanaimous decision. Approved.
- 2. Limiting commercial use of Town land
 This is starting the process of mostly updating the town's transient vendor ordinance and

dealing with the kayak issues from this summer. Two citations were written and taken to court. The town's attorney suggested setting up a permitting process to keep limits on commercial use of the town's land. M. Lazorik moved to have the town attorney draft town ordinances on town land use for commercial activities and to set up a permitting process for the rental of boats or kayaks in the Town of Bell. The motion was 2nd by Y. Fleming. Unanimous decision. Approved. The ordinance would make it clear that town land cannot be used for commercial use, which is already in the state statues.

- 3. Keeping Town road right of way clear- discussion

 There have been problems with people parking and leaving things in the road right of way.

 This is creating problems with snowplowing and brushing. It is important to keep it open and to make everyone aware of this.
- 4. Abandoning Town road 15- discussion This was tabled until next month.

Committee/Project Reports:

Fire Department/Ambulance – The South Shore Ambulance had one run to the Town Orienta. The Fire Dept. had one run, that was a false fire alarm.

Roads-Roads froze before plowing, putting them in good shape for plowing.

Planning Commission-They are going over the sign ordinance criteria. They will be finalizing it at their next meeting.

Marina-Andy Peterson is working on replacing wood on the docks.

Parks and Lands/Green Shed-No report.

Community Center-Activities has been slow. Bill Draeger and Judy Kerr are working on the 2017 calendar. A second line is needed for the public.

Library/Notices-New information is being placed on the message board. One of the library board members that is the secretary is retiring and Richard Dunn will be the replacement. They are helping out the little library at the flowing well and the little library at Herbster. Any information on things happening in town can be emailed to Yvette Fleming. The Mission Outreach has offered to put up a new message board at the Star North Gas Station, in the laundry mat.
